Council News & Activities:

Jim Calbaretta Essay Contest: We received 68 contest essay submissions for our current contest (#19 in our Council's history). The distribution was as follows: 41 from junior high, 22 from high school and 5 from college. At this time, the essays are being reviewed by several qualified judges for an independent and blind review. We will be awarding essay prizes totaling \$20,000 in the Spring. Given that we have more prizes than contestants in college, we will likely move the unused prize money to the other divisions so that a few more contestants can benefit.

2022 Dues: In mid-December, you should have received a notice form our Treasurer (**Br. Cosmo Amato**) to pay your 2022 membership dues. We have held steady our Council dues for 2022 keeping them at prior year levels. Your notice indicates the specific amount owed depending on whether you are a Benefit or Associate Member. Your dues need to be paid before the end of January to avoid any late fees.

2022 Death Benefits: Also, the Treasurer's notice covers the YMI #613 optional death benefit program. A fee of \$30 is owed by January 31st, which provides coverage of \$1000 for 2022.

Grand President's Visit: We will be hosting our Grand President, Br. Nick Franceschine #54, for a visit on **January 11th.** We will be joined that evening for a special meeting by several YMI Brothers of South San Francisco #32 to enjoy fraternalism and to hear from our YMI Grand Officers about upcoming events and activities. Christmas Party Remarks Br. Mike Amato

Ladies and Brothers....It's great to be back here after a one-year break from hosting our Christmas Party. It's truly awesome to see so many of you here tonight to celebrate the Christmas holiday together. I had feared that we might see a drop-off in attendance, but I'm very pleased to report that the 77 people here tonight, are more than those who attended our last Christmas Party in 2019!

Tonight, I stand here again at this podium filled with pride to report many YMI #613 accomplishments in 2021. Despite the various challenges created by COVID, we continued to keep working together meeting on-line over Zoom. This past summer, we were able to resume in-person meetings adding Zoom meeting access for those YMI Brothers with health issues or who live a distance away. As a result, we managed to flourish as a YMI Council this past year.

- First, YMI #613 enjoyed a phenomenal year for **Membership** as we **initiated 15 new or transferred members since last December!** As a result, our current membership roster has risen to a **modern day high of 109 members!** Let me take a moment here:
 - o to thank **Br. Art Jimenez, Br. Dominic Panina, & Br. John Kavanagh** for working with me to increase our membership.
 - o and to welcome **four** new YMI #613 Brothers that are here tonight:
 - Br. Bryan Handlos Br John Bower Br. George Totah Br. Kyle Dowd
- Our finances this year are quite healthy! Largely through astute investing by our Investment Committee led by Br. John
 Cleary and the prudent money oversight of our Treasurer Br. Cosmo Amato, YMI #613 is currently at its highest financial
 point in at least the past 20 years, and I suspect in our 114-year history.
- Rather than sit on our good fortune, YMI #613 has generously given back much needed funds for our community. In 2021, YMI #613:
 - o awarded \$20,000 in essay contest awards to 57 students in our 18th Annual Jim Calabretta Essay Contest!
 - o provided another **\$8000** in scholarship assistance to eight 8th graders in San Francisco who are attending Catholic High Schools!
 - o contributed another **\$7000** in **donations** thus far to worthy non-profits helping church organizations, youth groups, our military, those that are ill, or those in need. I suspect we may even hit \$8000 in donations at our Tuesday meeting!
- We have also recently re-instituted our canned food & toiletry drive under Br. Mike Dimech's leadership. Tonight --- thanks to your generosity--we have all these goods to share with those in need at the San Bruno Catholic Workers Hospitality House.
- Through the YMI Seminarian Education Foundation and thanks primarily to Br. Cosmo Amato, YMI #613 sponsored 31 seminarians from Salesian and St. Patrick's Seminaries for scholarship awards totaling remarkedly over \$13,000!
- Once again, YMI #613 had the **highest percentage** of YMI Brothers' participating in YMI Pro Patria Raffle among Councils with over 20 members. We impressively reached a **38% participation** level in 2021! And I am hearing we're off to a nice start for 2022 with about **22% already buying tickets**. (Please buy raffle tickets if you haven't already! If you can't find them, let Br. Dimech or me know!)
- In this year's Grand Council Pro Patria Essay Contest, YMI #613 had a major impact, sponsoring **7 of the 15 contest** winners in the high school division for over \$4000 in contest prizes!
- Finally, we have resumed our popular social events following public health rules. Besides tonight's Christmas Party, YMI #613 recently renewed its participation in the Italian Heritage Parade in October and held its Hour of Memory in November honoring those YMI Brothers who passed away.

In looking back at these many accomplishments, I estimate we have collectively given or enabled to be given about \$55,000 in 2021 to students, seminarians, and worthwhile causes. Folks, we deserve a HUGE round of applause. I will note here that much credit for this success needs to go our President Br. Bob Fiorito, his VP's Br. Joe Soracco and Rod Ordona, and the entire group of YMI #613 Officers & Committee Members for their tremendous leadership

As 2022 approaches, I am optimistic that we can continue to proceed in a positive direction:

- We will be hosting the 19th annual Jim Calabretta Essay Contest in the Spring, thanks to our contest chair **Br. John Kavanagh,** with an announced prize fund of **\$20,000**! Hopefully this year we can do the ceremony in person after two years of relying on Zoom!
- We have a Budget already in place for 2022 that will allow us to provide a similar generous level of scholarship assistance and donations next year as we did in 2021!
- And we are moving to resume other popular Council social events (i.e., Ladies Night, Picnics, & Bocce Ball & Golf Tourneys), so we can return to normalcy!

So let me conclude thanking you **AGAIN** for all you did this past year, as well as to convey my wish that you **ALL** enjoy a Merry Christmas and a great New Year!
