

Greetings to my friends and Brothers, from San Jose Council #2.



"On A Roll" To Another Championship



On September 29th, YMI St. John Bosco Council #613 hosted the 5th Annual YMI Bocce Ball Tournament at Orange Park in South San Francisco. Under cool but comfortable weather conditions, a record number of 66 bocce players competed in this year's tournament. Those Brothers participating represented 6 YMI Councils (#1, #2, #32, #40, #54 & #613) led by our Grand President Frank Hepburn #2 and the 1st Lady Tomie Hepburn.

As with past bocce tournaments, sixteen teams alternated rolling bocce balls with the goal of coming closest to a small white ball called a "pallino". Points were scored by the team with bocce balls closest to the pallino and the first team reaching 12 points was declared the winner. Each team was guaranteed at least two games in a double elimination tournament format.

Those who attended witnessed many exciting and competitive bocce games. As midday approached, the sixteen team field shrank as teams were eliminated after their second loss. At the end of the day, two teams remained.....the two-time past champion "On A Roll" team (Br. Dominic Franco #32, Br. Norm Faria #32, Br. Danny Marcucci #32 and Hondo DeAlba) and a combo council team called "Team Mosta" (Angelo & Donna Dimech representing #613, Ron Ennis #1, and Rick Ochsenhirt #32)

The championship match was quite exciting with many impressive shots. Although Team Mosta won the first game, they needed to defeat On a Roll twice as Council #32's squad had gone undefeated the whole day. Alas this task proved too difficult, and On a Roll began to pull away scoring point after point. With the victory, Council #32 continued its bocce dynasty with its fifth consecutive championship!

Do Men Know Your Council Exists?

Brothers, in the last issue I asked everyone to reacquaint themselves with the reasons as to why the Young Men's Institute was founded. I then asked for everyone to think about what your Council is doing to meet those goals.

By meeting the goals of the YMI, every Council, no matter its size, should be known to all Catholic men and women in the parish, not to mention the parish priests. However, the truth is that many YMI Councils operate in the dark, so to speak, known only to their members. Our goal this year is for Catholic men to seek us out and join the "Brotherhood" rather than us chasing them down and asking them to join a group they know nothing or little about.

How does a Council become known? Well, the easiest way is to do something to get noticed, and the best place to do that is in your parish and community. There are many ways to get "noticed", and doing so doesn't involve a big project. A number of small things combined can equal one big involved activity, and those small things spread out over the course of the year can improve membership. Whereas, the big project comes and goes and is quickly forgotten by potential new members, small things during the year are remembered.

So, what are a few of those small things? An example would be having all of the Council Brothers wear their membership pin on a shirt collar Sunday mornings. Over the course of the year, people notice. Designate a person in the Council to make sure meeting days and times are printed in the parish bulletin, or simply have an announcement before or after Mass on the Sunday before the meeting. Potential Brothers can't find you if they don't know when and where you meet.

Think about small parish service projects, and by that I mean activities that all members of the parish can afford and be interested in. Here are a few ideas that have worked for various Councils. Sponsor a "Donut Sunday" once in awhile, especially if your parish

doesn't have one. If money is a concern, simply ask for a donation. You'll be surprised at what happens. If your parish is small, try an occasional Sunday Breakfast, again ask for a donation rather than charge a fixed price. That way every parishioner can come, and a good breakfast along with good company is a selling point for the YMI. The same is true for an inexpensive parish dinner. The idea isn't to make a lot of money, but rather to offer a service to the parish and community. Lenten soup suppers are fairly easy to do. Pick a day, after an evening "Stations of the Cross" works well. The Council provides two kinds of homemade soup, bread, and water to drink. Remember, its Lent. Ask for a donation, and donate any profit to the parish food bank or other worthy cause. I'm sure your Council Brothers can come up with even more ways to be noticed without involving a lot of work.

If your Council is already doing activities like those that I have mentioned, then congratulations. You are well on the way to sustaining and growing your membership. If you or your Council have any other ideas that can help recruit members, then please share them with Grand Council, and they in turn will pass your ideas on to all the Councils.

When people see us fulfilling our motto, "Pro Deo—Pro Patria, by helping our Church and community, they say, "I want to find out about those guys. They seem to be having a lot of fun". As many of us know, wives give the elbow in the ribs and say, "You should join that group".

If you want to have people join you, then, you need to let people know who you are, what you do, and when and where you meet.

It is with great sadness that the Grand Council Office announces the death of Charles J. Elliott #1, Past Grand President. Brother Chuck passed away late in the afternoon on Wednesday, November 21, 2012. He died at home with his wife and family in attendance. Brother Chuck joined the YMI in 1974 as a loyal member of San Francisco Council #1. He served and continued to serve as an officer in his Council for many years. He was elected as a Grand Director in 1983 and served until 1987 in that capacity. He was Chairman of the Board from 1984-1985. He was elected Grand Second Vice President at the Grand Council Session held in Santa Nella in 1987. He was appointed Grand First Vice President in December of 1987 and elected to a full term in that position at the 1988 Grand Council Session held in San Jose. In 1989 he was chosen as Grand President in Oakland and presided at the Grand Council Session in Hilo, Hawaii in 1990. In addition to being a member of San Francisco Council #1, he never let anyone forget he was an honorary member of South San Francisco Council #32. He attended every Grand Council Session up until last year, he was a member of the YMI Educational Foundation for a number of years and he was always there to help each and every YMI Brother. YMI CELEBRATES ITALIAN HERITAGE

The YMI participated in the 144th Italian Heritage Columbus Day Parade on October 7, 2012 in San Francisco's North Beach. Through a partnership between YMI St John Bosco Council #613 and the San Francisco Model -A Ford Auto Club again, the YMI made another impressive appearance in the parade riding in six exquisite antique cars from the late 1920's and early 1930's, as well as a beautiful 1951 yellow Mercury.

Leading our YMI contingent this year was **Grand President Frank Hepburn #2** and his wife **Tomie.** Br. Frank wore his green YMI #2 jacket and his green YMI hat and complimented it with a red shirt, while Tomie appropriately adorned a wardrobe of Italian colors. Br. Frank and Tomie rode proudly in the 1951 Mercury around the wharf area, as thousands of people cheered. Unfortunately, their Mercury overheated and the car had to pull out of the parade. Nonetheless, Br. Frank and Tomie took to foot and both reported having a great time.

Our YMI contingent also featured the **Grand Secretary Mike Amato #613** riding in a 1929 Model A Ford, with a banner provided by his YMI #613 Brothers recognizing his **2012 Man of the Year Award**. In addition, **Reverend Armand Oliveri**, the 93-year old Chaplain of YMI #613, rode in a 1934 Ford Phaton. Fr. Armand has presided faithfully as a priest in North Beach for most of his sixty plus years of service to God. Several other YMI #613 officers rode in the parade as well, including **Brothers Cosmo Amato**, **Bob Fiorito**, **Joe Soracco and Ryan Casey**.

The antique cars were adorned with big signs prominently bearing the YMI name and logo. In addition, the cars were decorated with American and Italian flags, as well as red, green and white balloons. As we rode through Fisherman's Wharf and up Columbus Avenue into North Beach, we were elated to see many friendly faces in the crowd cheering us, including **Grand Marshal Richard Burke #5.**

As we earned a first place award in the parade's Antique Car category in 2011, we are hopeful that we will continue to be recognized for our stylish parade presence. Special thanks to **Brother Bob Fiorito #613** for helping organize our involvement in the parade.

In 2003, Bishop Stephen Blaire of the Stockton Diocese invited the Young Men's Institute to help establish an independent, nonprofit organization to support his commitment to providing the opportunity for Catholic education to as many children as possible in the Diocese of Stockton. Under the leadership of the Young Men's Institute (represented by Brothers Tom Fourie, Jerry DeGroot, Dan Casteline and Jim Mullen) SEEDS was established to plant Catholic education in the lives of less fortunate students.

Since the 2004-05 school year, SEEDS awarded scholarships to 1,206 students totaling \$1,063,600.00. The Bishop's Awards Dinner, the Christmas Card solicitations and Church for Tomorrow are the focus for fundraising.

In addition SEEDS accepts donations of any monetary value.

Once again, the YMI Educational Foundation is proud to announce our Matching Funds Program for 2012-2013. The intent of this program is to enhance and support YMI Councils which have viable student scholarship programs in existence or are planning to have one during this school year.

All YMI Councils are encouraged to participate in this beneficial educational program. A cherished hallmark of the YMI has been to provide for the continued education of our young people.

Each Council may request any amount up to \$500 in Matching Funds. Upon approval of the submitted request, the Educational Foundation will in turn write a check of any amount not to exceed \$1000 to the educational institution selected or the Council scholarship program as designated by the requesting Council. The requesting Council's general membership must vote for the request of Matching Funds during a regular business meeting, prior to submitting the Matching Funds Application which will be mailed to each Council's Recording Secretary in January 2013.

To participate in this program a Council must be participating or planning to participate in a scholarship program during this school year. A description of this participation is required on the application form (see page 11 of this issue of the Journal) that must be completed, submitted and postmarked not later than **April 1, 2013**. Barring a special circumstance request, Matching Fund checks will all be issued and mailed on **April 30, 2013**.
