On September 28th, YMI St. John Bosco Council #613 hosted the 6th Annual YMI Bocce Ball Tournament at Orange Park in South San Francisco. Under gorgeous skies, 16 bocce teams representing 5 YMI Councils (#1, #32, #40, #54 & #613) competed in this year's tourney.


As with past tournaments, bocce teams alternated rolling bocce balls with the goal of coming closest to a small white ball called a "pallino". Points were scored by the team with bocce balls closest to the pallino and the winner was the first team reaching 12 points. Each team was guaranteed at least two games in a double elimination tournament format.

Those present witnessed many exciting and competitive bocce games. As midday approached, the sixteen team field had lessened as teams were eliminated after their second loss. By late afternoon, only two teams from Council #32 were left standing.... the past champion "On A Roll" (Brother Dominic Franco #32, Brother Norm Faria #32, Danny Marcucci and Hondo DeAlba) and a new challenger called "City Council One" led by Brother Rick Ochsenhirt #32 and a few of his bocce buddies from South City.

Championship matches are typically exciting as the player's skill level is quite high and the shots can be remarkable, almost touching the pallino. This year's tourney kept to form as "On a Roll" defeated the "City Council One" in a terrific match, where each team battled fiercely for points, until "On A Roll" rolled itself to a dramatic 12-9 win. 

YMI RIDES IN ITALIAN HERITAGE PARADE

The YMI participated in the 145th Italian Heritage Columbus Day Parade on October 13 2012 in San Francisco's North Beach. Through a long-standing partnership between YMI St John Bosco Council #613 and the San Francisco Model -A Ford Auto Club, the YMI impressively rode in style during the parade via seven magnificent antique cars (circa late 1920's to the early 1960's), including a 1929 Model A Ford.

As has been a new YMI tradition in recent years, the Grand President has led a YMI delegation in the parade. Accordingly, **Grand President Joe Reza #100** proudly wore his beige YMI #100 polo shirt as he rode in the back seat of a beautiful cherry-red 1962 Buick Skylark with his lovely wife Lorraine Reza. Br. Joe shared that the experience of waving to the large boisterous crowd lining the streets of San Francisco was in a word "Awesome!".

The YMI contingent also featured **Reverend Armand Oliveri**, the 93-year old former Chaplain of YMI #613 and a neighborhood favorite who has presided faithfully as a Salesian priest in North Beach for most of his sixty-plus year career in religious life. Although Fr. Armand began the parade in a stunning 1960's Thunderbird, he had to switch to the 1929 Model -A Ford after the T-bird overheated en route. Also representing the YMI at the parade were the following

- Brother Steve Cresci (President #32) and his wife Linda and
- Several YMI #613 brothers including Brothers Bob Fiorito (1st VP #613), Joe Soracco (2nd VP #613) and Ryan Casey.

As we rode through Fisherman's Wharf and along Columbus Avenue into North Beach, we were elated to see many friendly faces in the crowd cheering us including **Br. Tony Aguirre** #100.

Having won the first place award in the parade's Antique Car category the past two years, we are hopeful that we will continue to be recognized for our stylish parade presence. Special thanks to Br. Bob Fiorito #613 for organizing our involvement in the parade.

Once again, the YMI Educational Foundation is proud to announce our Matching Funds Program for 2013-2014. The intent of this program is to enhance and support YMI Councils which have viable student scholarship programs in existence or are planning to have one during this school year.

All YMI Councils are encouraged to participate in this beneficial educational program. A cherished hallmark of the YMI has been to provide for the continued education of our young people.

Each Council may request any amount up to \$500 in Matching Funds. Upon approval of the submitted request, the Educational Foundation will in turn write a check of any amount not to exceed \$1000 to the educational institution selected or the Council scholarship program as designated by the requesting Council. The requesting Council's general membership must vote for the request of Matching Funds during a regular business meeting, prior to submitting the Matching Funds Application which is printed in this issue of the Institute Journal.

A description of this participation is required on the application form (see page 11 of this issue of the Journal) that must be completed, submitted and postmarked not later than April 1, 2014. Barring a special circumstance request, Matching Fund checks will all be issued and mailed on April 30, 2014.
