the delegates also approved the raising of the per capita tax from \$24 to \$27 for all Benefit and Associate members.

Resolutions were prepared and read by Brother Nick Franceschine #54. They included one for Rev. Norman King of Immaculate Conception Church in Sparks, Nevada for his many years of welcoming the YMI Grand Council to his parish as well as his impending retirement, and one for Brother Wendell Serrao #573 for his 50th year anniversary of attending Grand Council Sessions.

Br. Tom Fourie #32, PGP and Business Manager presented the workshop with much emphasis on the importance of submitting correct Semi Annual Reports. The most recent reports had 70% mistakes on page 1. WE MUST DO A BETTER JOB!!!. This issue of record keeping and submitting Council Semi Annual Reports is a critical part for the Grand Council keeping accurate records. So to all Council Presidents, Secretaries, and Treasurers, let us be more thorough and timely with our reports.

Our Session closed with a wonderful and unique Mass and Installation Ceremony, followed by the Grand Banquet and its fraternal program.

In closing, I wish to thank my district Deputies and everyone for contributing time, confidence and knowledge in making my journey as your Grand President rewarding and filled with personal growth, with the special guidance of my mentoring Brothers: Br. 


