

YMI TAKES 1ST PLACE IN THE ITALIAN HERITAGE PARADE

YMI St. John Bosco Council #613 received news that it earned a 1st Place Award from its participation in the 148th San Francisco Italian Heritage Columbus Day Parade on October 9, 2016. With the award, the YMI earned a check for \$125!!!

The YMI has been involved in the oldest Columbus Day Parade in America for nine years now. Through a long-standing partnership between YMI St John Bosco Council #613 and the San Francisco Model-A Ford Auto Club, the YMI's parade entry featured eight stunning motor vehicles (circa 1920's-1940's) including a 1938 San Francisco bus that had traveled through the streets of North Beach when **Brothers Dick Pisciotta**, **Cosmo Amato and Frank Pignati** were young kids in that neighborhood. The contingent also featured a spectacular modern 2016 Polaris that looked like the Batmobile. Each vehicle was adorned with signs prominently bearing our YMI name and logo and decorated with several American and Italian flags, as well as with many red, green and white balloons (the colors of the Italian flag).

As has been the tradition, the YMI Grand President leads the parade delegation and this year Grand President Mike Dimech #613 had this honor sitting in the front seat of a classic gem from yesterday. Grand Secretary Mike Amato #613 rode in the Batmobile looking vehicle, while Grand Director Bob Fiorito #613 drove a 1930 Model-A Ford with a rumble seat. Several other YMI #613 Brothers (Br. Joe Soracco, Ryan Casey and Jeff Morrow) and their families rode in the other vehicles. In keeping with the Italian way of life, plenty of wine was on hand to enjoy, along with several Italian culinary specialties (salami, prosciutto, focaccia, biscotti). All the YMI participants reported having a wonderful experience witnessing thousands of people cheering the YMI entry as it wound its way through the streets of Fisherman Wharf and North Beach.

Next year will be the YMI's 10th year of parade participation and we look forward to an even grander experience!



To participate in this program a Council must be participating or planning to participate in a scholarship program during this school year. A description of this participation is required on the application form (see page 11 of this issue of the Journal) that must be completed, submitted and postmarked not later than April 1, 2017. Barring a special circumstance request, Matching Fund checks will all be issued and mailed on April 30, 2017.
