STATE OF THE INSTITUTE REPORT - 2019

Brothers,

Two proposals were presented to the State of the Institute Committee this year for consideration and to be voted on at the June 2019 Grand Session. The proposals presented to the Committee included the following:

- a. Changing the title of the Junior Past Grand President to Past Grand President Emeritus.
- b. Providing guidelines in the By-Laws governing the usage of reserve funds.

The Committee reviewed these two proposals and voted to present the following to our Brothers at the 134th Grand Council Session.

Proposal #1:

Current:

Article III, Section 7, BOARD OF GRAND DIRECTORS: The Board of Grand Directors shall consist of eight Grand Directors as provided for in the Grand Council Constitution, and as ex officio members with voice only, the Grand President, Junior Past Grand President, Grand Vice Presidents, Grand Secretary and the Grand Treasurer.....

Proposed Rewrite:

<u>Article III, Section 7, BOARD OF GRAND DIRECTORS:</u> The Board of Grand Directors shall consist of eight Grand Directors as provided for in the Grand Council Constitution, and as ex officio members with voice only, the Grand President, **Past Grand President Emeritus**, Grand Vice Presidents, Grand Secretary and the Grand Treasurer.....

Current:

<u>Article IV, Section 16, STATE OF THE INSTITUTE COMMITTEE:</u> This Committee shall consist of seven (7) members and shall have the Junior Past Grand President as Chairman....

Proposed Rewrite:

<u>Article IV, Section 16, STATE OF THE INSTITUTE COMMITTEE</u>; This Committee shall consist of seven (7) members and shall have the **Past Grand President Emeritus** as Chairman....

Rationale

Using the term "Junior" describes something that is minor, lower, low-ranking or secondary. A Past Grand President should not be thought of in this manner and it appears it is time to make a change.

Proposal #2:

Current:

Article IV, Section 14, RSERVE FUND COMMITTEE; Maintain current language and add the following

Proposed Rewrite is to add:


Reserve Fund usage is as follows:

- 1. To make up the difference in YMI Grand Council annual budget when expenses exceed income.
- 2. Each Council which sends one or more delegate(s) to the Grand Session shall receive from the Reserve Fund up to \$500.00 per Council to help defray the expense of sending delegate(s) to the Grand Session. The amount will be determined by a vote of the Board of Grand Directors at the January Board of Grand Director's meeting and each Council will be notified of the availability of such funds.
- 3. Any recommendations made by and approved by the YMI Board of Grand Directors.

Rationale:

Since the YMI By-Laws do not set guidelines for the usage of the Reserve Funds, there is a need for the Order to identify what the funds can be used for and this information should be placed in the By-Laws.
