
Unfortunately, no winners were in attendance but nonetheless a good time was had by all who were there that night.



# STATE OF THE INSTITUTE

#### Brothers,

The following proposal seeks to change the YMI Death Benefit Program to allow greater membership participation in this program. This proposal would specifically revise two sections of the existing By-Laws as presented below to set forth this change and a rationale for the proposal has been attached. If adopted, the two-tier membership distinction between Benefit and Associate Members would be eliminated and basically all YMI Members (*excluding Honorary and Junior YMI Members*) would be eligible for YMI Death Benefits going forward.

After getting a legal opinion that we may change the YMI Death Benefit Program in accordance with YMI By-Law procedures, the State of the Institute Committee reviewed and discussed this specific proposal and approved it for consideration at this 137<sup>th</sup> Grand Council Session in June. All YMI Brothers, especially YMI voting delegates, should review the proposal and its supporting rationale prior to its presentation at the Grand Council Sessions and a secret ballot vote.

### **Proposed Changes to YMI By-Laws**

1. Article VI, Section 1.

#### Existing language:

Section 1: **DEATH BENEFIT**: Effective June 23, 2020, upon the death of a Benefit Member, who is in good standing in his Council as defined in this Article, his beneficiary shall receive the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) from Grand Council within thirty (30) days after notice and proof of his death has been submitted to the Grand Secretary by the Council, and upon the approval of the Board of Grand Directors. This sum shall be the exclusive and total Death Benefit to be paid to the beneficiary of a Benefit Member of the Young Men's Institute.

#### Proposed language:

Section 1: **DEATH BENEFIT**: Effective July 1, 2022, upon the death of a Benefit Member, who is in good standing in his Council as defined in this Article, and who has been a member of the Young Men's Institute for at least five (5) years at the time of his death, his beneficiary shall receive the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) from Grand Council within thirty (30) days after notice and proof of his death has been submitted to the Grand Secretary by the Council, and upon the approval of the Board of Grand Directors. This sum shall be the exclusive and total Death Benefit to be paid to the beneficiary of a Benefit Member of the Young Men's Institute. The five-year membership requirement in this paragraph shall not apply to anyone who was a Benefit Member prior to July 1, 2022.

2. Article VII, Section 1.

#### Existing language:

Section 1 **MEMBERSHIP**: Organization membership shall be divided into the following categories: (a) A Benefit Member is under age forty-five (45) at the time he begins his YMI membership. Said member is entitled to the Grand Council Death Benefit and Educational Foundation Benefits providing he is in good standing with his Council as defined in Article VI of the Grand Council By-Laws.

- (b) An Associate Member is age forty-five (45) or above at the time he commences YMI membership. Said member is entitled to Educational Foundation Benefits but not entitled to the Grand Council Death Benefit.
- (c) Honorary Members are limited to Catholic priests, seminarians and members of religious communities (i.e. deacons, brothers, etc.). Said member shall be exempt from all Grand Council dues and assessments and is not entitled to Grand Council Death Benefits nor Educational Foundation Benefits.
- (d) Junior YMI Members are limited to young men between the ages of 13-23, who are either full-time students or active in military service, as verified by the respective Councils. Such members shall be exempt from all Grand Council dues and assessments, but are similarly not entitled to the Grand Council Death Benefit nor the Educational Foundation Benefits. At age 24, said member will convert to Benefit Membership status and be eligible for the Grand Council Death Benefit and Educational Foundation Benefits.

#### Proposed language:

- Section 1 MEMBERSHIP: Organization membership shall be divided into the following categories:

   (a) A Benefit Member is a member who is not an Honorary Member or a Junior YMI Member, as defined below. Said member is entitled to the Grand Council Death Benefit and Educational Foundation Benefits providing he is in good standing with his Council as defined in Article VI of the Grand Council By-Laws.
  - (b) Honorary Members are limited to Catholic priests, seminarians and members of religious communities (i.e. deacons, brothers, etc.). Said member shall be exempt from all Grand Council dues and assessments and is not entitled to Grand Council Death Benefits nor Educational Foundation Benefits.
  - (c) Junior YMI Members are limited to young men between the ages of 13-23, who are either full-time students or active in military service, as verified by the respective Councils. Such members shall be exempt from all Grand Council dues and assessments but are similarly not entitled to the Grand Council Death Benefit nor the Educational Foundation Benefits. At age 24, said member will convert to Benefit Membership status and be eligible for the Grand Council Death Benefit and Educational Foundation Benefits.

#### **Rationale for changes:**

The purpose of these changes is to extend the YMI Death Benefit to all current Associate Members. The reason for these changes is simple, basic common-sense <u>fairness</u>.

The change to Article VI adds a 5-year "vesting" requirement. It requires that a member must be in the YMI at least 5 years before the death benefit is paid. This is a safeguard to protect the YMI from many people attempting to join us while very ill, merely to get the death benefit. Brothers who are already Benefit Members are not affected by this change. Nearly all our Brothers already have 5 years in the YMI, so this shouldn't be a problem for our members.

The change to Article VII redefines "Benefit Member" to include everyone who is currently either a Benefit Member or an Associate Member.

The practical effects of these changes will be:

- For current Associate Members, their beneficiaries will now be eligible for the same death benefits as Benefit Members.
- For current Benefit Members, there is no change. Nothing is being taken away.
- The quarterly assessments for Councils will increase by \$3 times the number of Associate Members. So instead of paying \$3 for each Benefit Member every quarter, the Council will pay \$3 for each member every quarter.
- The dues for Associate Members in most Councils will increase to cover the difference in assessments. In most Councils, Benefit Members already pay more in dues than Associate Members do, because of that \$12 per year assessment. This works out to about \$1 per month.

The cost of these proposed changes can be illustrated by these estimates of the value as of December 31, 2021 of future death benefits from (1) the current Death Benefit program, compared to (2) these proposed changes:
