YMI EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION BROTHER FRANK PIGNATI MATCHING FUNDS PROGRAM

The Educational Foundation is once again announcing the Matching Funds program for 2025. The intent of this program is to enhance and support YMI Councils which have viable student scholarship programs in existence or are planning to have one during this school year. Each Council may request any amount up to \$1,250 in Matching Funds. Upon approval of the request, the Educational Foundation will return a check of up to \$2,500 to the educational institution selected by the Council.

Francis Council has once again chosen to participate in this program with the anticipated Matching Funds going to the 2025 St. Joseph High School graduation awards.
