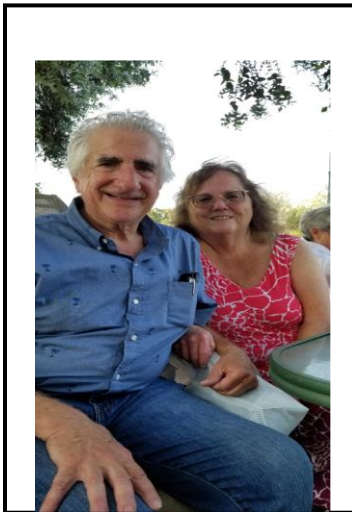

## Summary of the 138<sup>th</sup> YMI Grand Council Session *From the Podium* by Grand President Darrell Fonseca



Thank you to all of my YMI Brothers who participated in the Young Men's Institute Grand Council Session held June 19-21, 2023 at Bally's Hotel & Casino in Stateline, Nevada and at St. Theresa's Catholic Church in South Lake Tahoe, California. It was a privilege to preside and I appreciate your help in making this Convention one of the best!

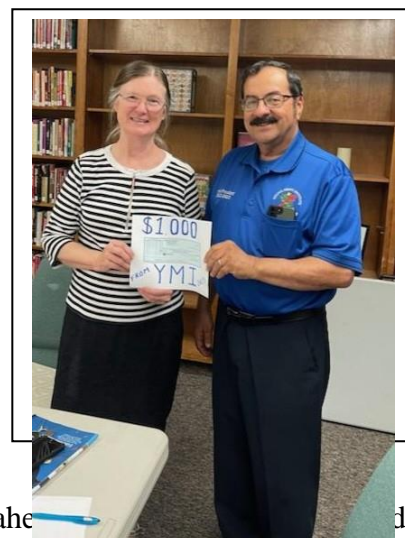
The convention week began on Monday with arrivals obtaining their credentials and conference information in the hotel lobby from Brothers Cosmo Amato GIS and Mike Dimech GS/PGP. The nearby chairs filled quickly as many brothers and their ladies socialized.

In the afternoon, we attended the opening Mass at St. Theresa's, celebrated by Father Agnel Heredia, Grand Chaplain. Br. Tom Fourie PGP and Br. Bob Bartoli PGP conducted the annual Remembrance Ceremony during which the names of our Brothers who died in the past year were read solemnly and the PGP's who died were eulogized.

Tuesday morning began with an 8:00 am buffet breakfast with our wives and guests. The first (Red) 50/50 Raffle was held. At 10:00 am, as the 132<sup>nd</sup> Grand President, I called the 138<sup>th</sup> Grand Council Session to order. The opening ceremonies were conducted, with opening prayer, opening song which was the official YMI song, pledge of allegiance, and roll call. There were 48 voting delegates present. As Immediate Past Grand President Nick Franceschine was unable to attend taking care of his wife who was ill, I appointed the previous PGP, Br. Mike Amato to fill the duties of IPGP. With two absences on the Grand Board of Directors, I appointed Brothers Mario Borba from Council #44 (Holy Rosary/Hilmar) and Rich Murphy from Council #32 South San Francisco as Acting Board members. I appointed PGP Mike Nelson #80 to serve as Parliamentarian. First time delegates were introduced. GS Michael Dimech PGP read the rules of the convention, and the rules were approved. I announced that this year's Charity Box donations will be distributed with the first \$1,000 to United for Life, a non-profit, 501c3 organization that is pro-life and supports expectant mothers and their children; and the balance going to Seminarian Education Foundation. Our Grand Chaplain, Fr. Agnel, who we learned has a doctorate!, gave an inspiring 35 minute talk about the Shroud of Turin.

Grand Treasurer Jack Albrecht gave the Treasurer's Report. As we were about to recess, we were invited to allow the Seminarian Foundation led by Br. Larry Andreatta to conduct their annual meeting. We then recessed for a very good in-house box lunch.

At 1:00 pm, we re-convened for the State of the Institute Committee Report which included four items to be considered and voted on later. For the first time ever at a convention, Committee Chairman Br. Nick Franceschine participated virtually via Zoom. Following a lengthy report and discussion, the YMI recessed. When recalled to order, Br. Duarte Monteiro led the annual meeting of the Educational Foundation. Following the meeting, the YMI re-convened and I asked, “With the exception of the Membership Committee, does any Committee Chair have any clarifications to make or have any late information not included in the written reports?” There were none. I then asked, “With the exception of the Membership Committee, does any Delegate have any questions to ask or any additional information regarding any of these reports?” There were none. I then opened comment on the Membership Committee and yielded time to Br. Manuel Drummond #44 PGP to address the delegates. Br. Drummond spoke about various aspects of Membership recruiting, provided an historical perspective, and offered many suggestions. Following his comments, I asked if any delegate had any other comments or questions regarding this or any other committee. There were none. I then entertained a motion to accept and approve all Committee Reports as presented. It was moved and seconded and passed unanimously.

Next, I introduced my District Deputies and asked them to stand. I referred to them as my 12 Apostles and thanked them for their work in promoting my program and assisting me with setting up our official visits.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> 50/50 Raffle (White) was held. I then appointed Brothers Phil Fondale #900 (At-Large/Pioneer) and Jim Rohe #612 (Gonzaga/Richmond, Indiana) to serve as the Election Committee and ballots were distributed and collected. We recessed the Tuesday proceedings.

Tuesday evening we hosted a “Heavenly Social” at Club Blu in Bally’s with our wives and guests and it lasted well into the night.

On Wednesday morning I called the Grand Session to order, following the usual opening ceremonies, prayer, flag salute, I asked all members who ever served in the military to stand and I thanked them for their service. About a dozen Brothers had served in the Armed Forces. Br. Rich Guaraldi PGP again led us in a song, fulfilling my request for, “America, the Beautiful.” Roll Call and Communications followed. Then, Br. Phil Fondale, GM and Election Committee Chair announced the results of yesterday’s voting. Item One to Eliminate District Deputy Grand Presidents Yes 19% No 81%, Item Two to Eliminate certain committees and reorganize others Yes 36% No 64%, Item Three to reorganize the duties of Grand Officers and Business Manager Yes 38% No 62 %, Item Four to codify changes of Grand Council #900 Yes 43% No 57%. A 2/3 favorable vote was required for passage. All four proposals were thus defeated.

I appointed Grand Chaplain Fr. Agnel, Business Manager Br. Tom Fourie PGP, Br. Bob Bartoli PGP, and Br. Phil Oberst PGP as the Installing Team for tonight’s Installation Mass. We then opened the Workshop and Br. Fourie instructed the assembly on Council requirements regarding Taxes, Insurance, Beneficiary Forms, and Council Bylaws.

**We then moved on to Sports Reports:**

Br. Mike Dimech GS/PGP announced that a YMI Bocce tournament will be held in the fall.

Grand First Vice President Br. Steve Cresci gave his annual report focusing on the success of the Pro Patria raffle and Essay contest.

Grand Second Vice President Billy Avery presented his annual report and highlighted the Red & White Mass and dinner that followed.

Chairman of the Board Tommy Figueira of Hawaii's Francis Council #573 reviewed the Board of Directors activities over the past year. Grand Treasurer Jack Albrecht #32 provided the Annual Treasurer's Report and surprisingly, there were no questions. Grand Secretary Mike Dimech PGP gave his report. All were accepted and approved.

With great honor, I introduced our next Grand President and presented Br. Steve Cresci with a polo shirt emblazoned "Grand President 2023-2024." He introduced his District Deputies. We asked each of the First Time Delegates to give their impressions. During Good of the Order, four upcoming events were announced. We had our Closing Prayer, Collection of the Regalia, I handed the Gavel to Br. Steve who adjourned the meeting.

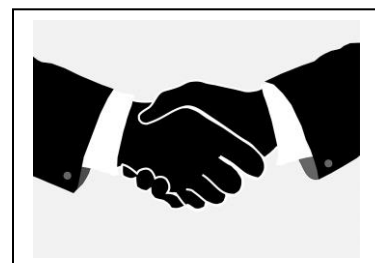
