On October 13th the YMI participated again in the San Francisco Italian Heritage Parade (the oldest Columbus Day celebration parade in America). Led by the efforts of YMI Inside Sentinel Bob Fiorito (YMI #613 President) and Grand Director Mike Amato (YMI #613's Board Chairman & Past President), St. John Bosco Council #613 partnered with a local auto club to provide 7 beautiful American classic cars from the late 1950's/early 1960's. Each vehicle was adorned with large signs prominently bearing our YMI name and logo, as well as decorated with American/Italian flags. Each vehicle also had several bags of hard candy, which the YMI Brothers shared with the many children that viewed the parade.



Grand Director Board Meeting Recap

The YMI Board of Grand Directors met via Zoom on Tuesday September 24th and Tuesday November 19th. The meetings were led by the Board Chairman (Br. Mike Amato #613), and many YMI Grand Directors and Officers participated. The following list provides highlights of the meetings:

- Grand President (GP) Billy Avery shared travel plans for his official visits, including a trip to Indiana after Thanksgiving.
- Grand Second Vice-President Richard Murphy #32 announced that the Red & White Mass would be scheduled for March 1st at All Souls Church in South San Francisco. GP Br. Avery #80 was going to investigate arranging a bus charter from the Central Valley for the event. More details to come.
- Br. Danny Avila #44 was named by GP Avery as a new Grand Director to replace Br. Steve May #40, who requested to resign from the Board for personal family reasons. The Board unanimously approved Br. Avila at the November Board Meeting.
- The Laws & Revisions (L&R) Committee chaired, by Br. Nick Franceschine #54, implemented
 appropriate language revisions to the YMI Grand Council By-Laws to reflect the four By-Law proposals
 that had been approved by YMI delegates in June 2024. The Board subsequently approved the
 revised By-Laws at the November Board Meeting. The revised By-Laws have been posted to the YMI
 Website.
- Technology Assessment Committee, chaired by Br. Gus Solidum #94, proposed recommendations to improve the stability and safety of YMI social media accounts, including setting up a new Gmail e-mail account and linking that new account to our Zoom, Facebook and YMI website accounts. The Board approved the recommendations at the November meeting.
- YMI finances look to be in good shape under Grand Treasurer Bob Bartoli's #32 oversight. The
 approved per capita increase has helped reduce the YMI budget shortfall, while YMI investments are
 doing well thanks largely to a robust stock market.
- The YMI Pasta Bingo fund-raising event has been scheduled for January 18th at St. Cecilia's Church in San Francisco. The event co-chairs are both past Grand Presidents: Br. Steve Cresci #32 and Br. Mike Dimech #613.
- YMI Golf Tourney was announced to be on April 27th in Castro Valley. The event co-chairs are YMI Sentinels: Br. Bob Fiorito #613 and Br. Paul Larson #32.

PLEASE NOTE: Checks cannot be made payable to individual councils, they MUST be issued to a Council's scholarship program, directly to a school, or directly to an individual student. **All checks will be mailed directly to the participating council's official address**.

- ➤ It may also examine the reports and recommendations of the Grand Officers, the Grand Council committees and of the Board, which it may include in its recommendations.
- > This may be changes and updates to the YMI By-Laws and Constitution.
- > The proposals are then presented at the Grand Convention to be voted upon by the delegates in attendance

Some of the recent past proposals that were approved were:

- > An increase in the death benefit.
- Extend the death benefit to current Associate Members
- Eliminate the designation of "Associate Member"
- ➤ Eliminate the fixed amount attendees pay for the Grand Council allowing for adjustment whenever necessary in the future.

The committee has some proposals that have been discussed. We are seeking recommendations for proposals from the Councils, Committees, or even an individual. A recommendation could be a change to a By-Law or an amendment to the By-Laws that is for the good of the order. The importance being as things continuously change, we need to chart the course for the future. We do have a deadline in January. 
